## Pou Make a Difference!

**Summer 2010** marks Galway Public Library's twelfth anniversary, and with your support we are getting better everyday!!

**Years from Yesterday...**Your library was established by a taxpayers' referendum in November 1997. The Galway Lodge of the Odd Fellows offered the use of their building as a home for the library.

On July 2, 1998, the library opened its doors to the public and offered a small selection of donated books. A dedicated group of volunteers manned the circulation desk twelve hours a week.



On May 25, 2000, the Galway Town Board passed a resolution to purchase the Odd Fellows' Hall for the express use as a library for the Town with funding from a State Legislative grant. Galway Public Library received its

provisional charter from the State of New York on July 14, 2000.



Your library in July of 2000 became a member of the Southern Adirondack Library System. This affiliation allows the library to take advantage of interlibrary loans and audio book downloads from a 60 member library system. In

June 2007 your library received a successful vote to form a School District Public Library. In October 2007 your library received a NY State Charter for a School District Public Library. (See page 2)




In our time of increasing utilities expense, retirement and insurance costs, coupled with shrinking government aid, grant opportunities and investment interest, your library relies upon the generous support of volunteers contributing over 180 hours/ month (a value of \$18,000 per year), the Friends, The Lions, Ballston Spa National Bank and numerous community members providing several thousand dollars of materials and supplies a year.

Due to an increase in patron usage, library event programming opportunities of Ballston Spa National Bank, presenting a and an expansion in library operating hours to better suit the community, your library enjoyed a tremendous increase in circulation this year. These successes have led to an increase in library staffing hours and an increase in certain salaries to bring them to local comparables. The largest portion of the library budget is personnel

because almost every aspect of your library's operation is an interactive experience between patrons and staff. Still your library's cost per person is well beneath local, state, and national averages. At \$15.04 per person per year, that is the purchase price of one hardcover book, or the rental of 5 dvd movies per year or a subscription to one magazine a year- an investment cost certainly smaller than the myriad resources available to you and your community through your library! *<i><i><i>Cibraries are for everyone!*
