Come Visit Your Library

According to our Annual Report in January:

- ♦ In 2014 your library had 25,000 visits with an annual circulation of 26,305 items and computer usage of 2,088 (not counting our wireless users!)
- We added a total of 3,775 items to our collection and increased our collection to 38,750! Library cards are held by 1,355 Galway School District residents!
- ♦ E-Book downloads reached an all-time high at 1,253!

Library Elections!

The 2015 Galway Public Library elections will be held on Tuesday, June 02, 2015, at the Galway Public Library, 5264 Sacandaga Rd. from 1:00p.m. to 8:00p.m at which time the polls will be opened to vote by paper ballot upon the following:

 Shall the budget for the Galway Public Library for the fiscal year 2015-2016 be approved and the amount of \$148,360 be raised for such purpose by taxes levied on all the taxable real property within the Galway Central School District? To elect two (2) trustees of the Galway Public Library to fill two (2) five-year terms commencing July 1, 2015.

A public information meeting on these items set forth to be voted upon will be held Tuesday, May 26, 2015, at 7:00 P.M. at the Galway Public Library.

All registered voters in the Galway Central School District are eligible to vote in the library election.

Absentee ballot applications are available at the library.

A Letter From the Board of Trustees

Dear Friends,

2014 has been an exciting, challenging and a bit frightening year for those of us on vironmental Quality Rethe Galway Public Library Board of Trustees as we have moved toward our goal of building a new library.

Preliminary Architectural Plans Last Spring we met with community residents and our architects and talked about what you wanted in your new library. In June, the architects presented their preliminary plans based on those requests. Those plans are at the library, and if you haven't taken the time to look at them, please do. And if you the property was placed see something you don't understand, or wish were different, please let us know. Even at this late date, ideas keep coming. We are truly delighted with your interest and concern.

SEQR Lead Agency We've met with the town and village officials and worked out our plans in conjunction 12- month period, we've

with their zoning requirements and have recently filed the SEQR forms -(the New York State Enview Act). We are now the lead agency for this activity and responsible for completing the SEQR process.

Dockstader Property We formed a community committee to decide the best use of the Dockstader property. Their advice was that as much as we'd like to keep the building, we would find it most difficult to renovate and maintain that space and build our new library at the same time. As a result, on the market and was recently sold to a couple who hope to restore the home and live in it right next to the new library - which they think will be a wonderful experience for their family!

Capital Campaign Committees During this same

formed a Steering Committee and a Public Relations Committee for the new building capital campaign. They are already making plans that will help us raise the money we need for the new building in addition to the referendum which we will hold in the fall.

Fundraising Events Several successful events have already been held and more of them are on the way: the Rocking Horse that was handmade and painted and delivered to its new home at Christmas Time, an event at Northshire Books, volunteer participation in the Lake George Polar Plunge, the Home Made Theater production of "The Man Who Came to Dinner" among them.

Special August Event on New Library Property Save the Date of Sunday Afternoon, August 23, for something Very Special at the new library site! We guarantee you and your family won't want to miss the performances by folk

singer Dan Berggren and Native American story teller Joseph Bruchac! All of these activities, plus the regular support given us by the Friends of the Library, for both the current library and programs and our new library as well, are helping us plan for our future. Little by little, it's all coming together. We know, like us, you can't wait for more parking space, a larger work area with more computers, and a new common area where you can sit down and look at a book, or a newspaper. . . rooms so that two groups can read or hear speakers at a time . . . where your children can enjoy reading activities no matter how little or big they are, and where the latest in technology will help your teens keep up with their class-room research. The First Shovel will be in the ground very soon, and with your help, the new Galway Library will spring to life! We can hardly wait!







- Your library is committed to staying relevant in today's increasingly technologically driven age.
- We have added 2 Samsung Tablets to the teen room to allow our teens the ability to surf the web, use educational apps, play games, read ebooks and more.
- We have added 2 iPad's to the children's area, this allows children the ability to use educational apps, read e -books, play educational games and more.

- Your library also has two new Kindle Fire tablets available for circulation, in addition to several Kindle's and Nooks that were previously available! See your circulation desk for details.
- Galway Public Library became the proud recipients of a Southern Adirondack Constuction Challenge grant in the amount of \$2133 to help us become more handicap accessible and ADA compliant.
- Galway Public Library became the proud recipients of a Southern Adirondack Technology Challenge grant in the amount of \$4,936.70 to partner with the school and help with STEAM and STEM skills using our littleBits program called Tinker Tuesday. We also use these materials for Tinker Thursday a free

- program for children who would like to build using littleBits.
- Your library is also the proud recipient of a New York State Education Department Division of Library Development Library Construction Grant in the amount of \$29,988 for site preparation of our new library site!
- Our Tinker programs allow children grades 3 and up to challenge their STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics) skills by issuing challenges in a makerspace environment with littleBits technology.
- Don't forget to join us for our celebration on the new library property August 23rd and enjoy some live entertainment!
