Nature Notes: Porcupines

One of the most fascinating and under appreciated mammals in our area is the North American Porcupine (Erethizon dorsatum), the second largest of all rodents.

While mostly nocturnal, porcupines may be seen foraging during the day, as my Cocker Spaniel recently discovered and quickly regretted. My husband and I were right behind him in the regret department — to the tune of a \$600 vet bill.

But I digress - back to porcupine appreciation: the porcupine is a peace-loving animal and its only (but very effective) defense are the quills (30,000 of them) that cover its upper body. The porcupine does not and cannot propel its quills but is more than happy to relinquish them if attacked; turning the aggressor instantly into the victim (just ask my dog). Besides humans, its only predator is the Fisher, which is agile enough to upend the porcupine and attack its quill-less underside.

The prickly porcupine is a herbivore and an excellent climber, feeding mostly on leaves and other green matter during spring and summer and nibbling on tree bark during the winter. They are especially fond of hemlock. If you find hemlock twigs littering the ground, look up. You might find a porcupine contemplating you from above.

If you happen upon a porcupine during a walk in the woods, appreciate this solitary, gentle creature — and keep your dog on a leash.
