Galway Town Board Meeting

Notes by Mary Cuffe Perez. The board voted to opt out of the Family Leave Act which would grant up to 12 paid weeks of family leave to town employees. The Board approved a resolution to override the NYS tax cap in 2018, which is currently 1% for Galway. Supv. Lent will investigate regulation and certification of solar farm installations in the town of Galway. Regulating mobile food wagons will also be researched further. Supv. Lent responded to a question about the Galway Highway Dept. that, by State Law, the Highway Supv. is an elected official and the dept. operates autonomously from the town government. The only authority the town has over the Highway Dept. is budgetary. It was asked if Supv. Lent, would support increasing the smoking age to 21 in Galway. He is not in favor, preferring public education. The full minutes will be on the town website after they are approved.
