



Notes from the Sept. 12 Galway Town Board Meeting, supplied by Mary Cuffe Perez: The Board will hold a **Public hearing at 6:45pm, Oct. 10** to adopt a local law to exceed the NYS tax cap, if necessary. Whether or not the town will need to exceed the tax cap is dependent upon overdue notice from NYS on what the cap will be for 2018. The town will receive a \$100,000 grant from the state to purchase a **new snow plow** to enhance its snow removal capabilities. The town will seek a four-year loan to finance the remainder of the cost of the plow. **Roadside and right-of-way tree trimming** by the Galway Highway Department was questioned by Mary Cuffe Perez and Bill Bateman. Galway Highway Supervisor, David Costanzo, will work with interested parties to formulate guidelines to achieve a balance between maintaining safe roads, and the beauty and viability of roadside trees. Minutes of the Town Board meetings are posted on the town website after the minutes are approved. The next meeting is October 10, 7pm, at Town Hall.
