Focus on Nature: the four generations of the Monarch Butterfly

The adult butterfly emerging from the chrysalis (pupa) in the photo on the first page will be the third generation of Monarchs born this summer. Like the two generations born before it, it will live for about three weeks, then lay eggs that will be the final generation with the mission to migrate thousands of miles South to their winter home in Mexico. So, not only do Monarchs go through four life cycles — the egg, caterpillar, pupa and adult butterfly — they also produce in a single year four generations of butterflies. Only the fourth generation, born in September or October lives on to migrate and overwinter in Mexico.

Monarchs are the only butterfly known to migrate as birds do. They depend upon the Milkweed plant for the caterpillars to feed upon; also, toxins they ingest from the sap helps deter predators during their long migration.
