### Galway Town Board Meeting —

Lots of news at the town board meeting held March 12 at the Town Hall.

New board member, Paul Lent, was welcomed to his first meeting. Councilmember Sue Sutch reported that the Farmer's Market Committee, after much research and consultation with area farmers' markets and farming organizations, drafted a vendor's

application and the committee will be soliciting local vendors for the Farmer's Market scheduled for the opening of the new pavilion on Route 147 on June 20. The market will be held on Fridays and there are plans to include fresh produce from local growers, meats, dairy, artisan cheese, breads and entertainment. "Every market day will be a community event," says Councilmember Sutch. An application for use of the pavilion by other community groups will also be drafted.

# A resolution was passed by the board to award \$2000 in seed money to launch the market.

This exciting new addition to Galway comes thanks to the Dockstader Foundation, the Galway Town Board and Bill Topper, former board member and engineer who donated hundreds of hours to the project, the Galway Highway Dept., and community volunteers.

Phyllis Keeler, Town Historian, reported that the contest for Galway students K-12 to design a weathervane for the pavilion is underway. The deadline for final designs is April 25. The prize for the winning design will be announced. Mrs. Keeler stated that the weathervane designs should have historical relevance as well as artistic merit. She noted that the town's history offers many rich possibilities and offered her help to students and their parents who would like to come to her office for ideas. Councilmember Sutch made a resolution to amend the current town board meeting policy to allow for a Question and Answer period at the end of each board meeting to help clarify for the public issues raised during the meeting.
