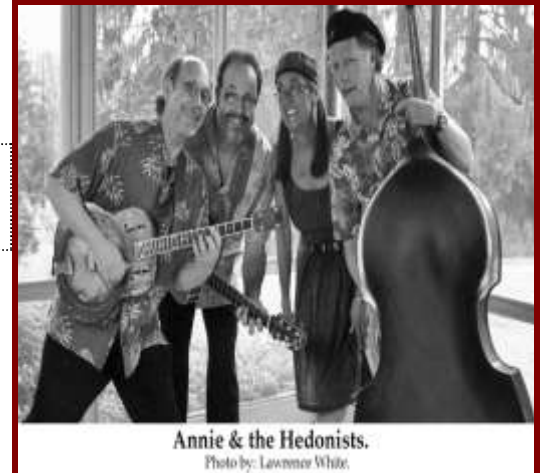
Services Available

The presentation will include a PowerPoint with photos of story tellers. Three Galway residents are among those whose stories will be read.

In doing inspections of properties with building permits or to clarify data on a property, it would be very helpful **if all residents would make sure that they have a number showing on their property.** This number should be large enough to see from the road or attached to the end of your driveway or even on your mailbox. This is not only helpful to me, but it could be a lifesaver should you need 911 assistance.
