Library Land Purchase—The Galway Public Library is pleased to announce that its Board of Trustees recently closed on the purchase of 13.59 acres of vacant land located in the Village of Galway for the future site of the new Galway Public Library facility.

Purchase of the land is part of the library's larger project plan to construct a new library building that will provide much needed space for access to collections, programs, technology services, community meeting space, and parking, as well as handicap accessibility. Funds for the land purchase of \$103,500 came from the Dockstader Charitable Trust (\$75,000) and the Library's Donor Designated Capital Funds (\$28,500).

About 5 medium Bananas 3 Tbps. Lemon juice 3 & 1/2 cup Sugar 1/8 Tsp. Butter 1 Pkg. Fruit pectin (Recipe continued next column)

Pour quickly into jelly glasses and cover with paraffin.

Nature Notes: A Good Apple Year

Plenty of rain and mild spring weather have conspired to bring us a good apple year in the Northeast. Every apple tree seems blessed with abundance, from backyard orchards, farms, roadsides, and even apple trees struggling for sunlight in the middle of the woods where farms used to be. All answered the call of a good apple year.

I am intrigued by the ancestral trees that were planted in our area around the turn of the century. One tree I know is at least 150 years old and still gives apples of a variety I cannot identify. Thoreau's beautiful little book, Wild Apples, gives us some history along with the romantic names of old apple varieties that make you want to go in search of them: The Saunterer's Apple, Dells in the Woods, the Meadow Apple, the Wine of New England, the Chickaree and many more. Could these apples be growing in our woods or back yards?
