Saratoga PLAN will host Earth Week celebration at the Galway Nature Preserve, 2519 Crane Rd., on April 19, 10am – 2pm. Come out and enjoy the start of spring with your family and learn about natural habitats, bark identification, the natural history of the preserve, and how to support birds and other wild creatures.

Gather family and friends for a letterboxing nature hunt adventure at 10:30am or at 12:30pm. Learn about bark identification and the history of the preserve on a guided nature walk at 11am or at 1pm. Come ready to hunt for the habitats of five animals, and make a mask of your favorite. Before you leave, create a peanut butter pinecone birdfeeder to take with you.

The Galway Nature Preserve's two miles of trails meander through pond habitat, stream crossings, conifer plantation and open fields, and offers an ideal place to study botany, wildlife habitats, and tree identification.

Saratoga PLAN announces the creation of a new Galway nature preserve on 105 acres north of the village. The Patricia S. Whitesell Conservation Easement covers a property off Route 147 owned by John R. Wolfe. The easement is named for his late wife. The property, located north of the Glowegee Creek, is part of a larger forest complex, bordered to the east and south by the 400-acre Camp Wood haven, a day camp used by the Girl Scouts of Northeastern New York. The mostly wooded land boasts mature hemlock groves, a beaver pond and two tributaries to the Glowegee. "The protection of the property will provide the Galway community with conserved forests, wetlands, stream habitats, and trail resources for future generations," said Maria Trabka, Saratoga PLAN executive director. Funding for transaction costs provided by a grant from the Dockstader Charitable Trust.
