Nature Notes: New England Asters -Mary Perez - In the Northeast, and certainly in our little corner of it, we are blessed with spectacular autumns - courtesy of oaks, maples, beech and ash (to name a few), down to the purple glow of New England Asters blooming from late August until mid October. *The beauty of these wild* native plants is enhanced by the company they keep -varieties of lesser asters, the fleabanes, with daisy like flowers in white, pink, purple and blue, and the striking *vellow Goldenrod – not to be* confused with the allergy producing Ragweed.

The Galway Food Pantry -

Servicing the entire boundary of the Galway Central School District along with Towns of Charlton & Providence for over 35 years! As a not-for-profit organization, the pantry helps to alleviate hunger and to aid people who are in need, especially those facing crises situations without regard to age, gender, ethnicity or religion. We are open every Thursday from 10 AM - 7 PM (and on an as needed basis by calling 882.5426). We are also available to assist families in obtaining SNAP (food stamps), HEAP (heating costs), Section 8 (housing) benefits and more. We also loan out wheelchairs, walkers and crutches free of charge (up to 3 months). The pantry is housed in the front part of the Galway Lions building located on East Street next to the Galway Ambulance Corps. We are both honored and privileged to be serving this wonderful community!
