Nature Notes – by MCPerez. Tree Hollows as Wildlife Habitat

While a hollowed out tree may look like nothing but dead wood, inside it is teaming with life. Many mammals and birds depend on decaying trees and trunks for shelter, roosting and nesting. In fact, that old tree may be the most active place in the woods. Natural tree hollows form in mature to old growth trees and are formed by many factors – insect or fungal infestation, damage by lightning or fire. The breach in the trunk may be expanded by cold and ice, or by woodpeckers and sapsuckers foraging for insects or sap. Over time the gap widens to offer accommodations for wildlife, such as squirrels, possums, raccoons and many birds. It can take up to 100 years for these hollows to become prime wildlife habitat, and the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation and others concerned with diminishing wildlife habitat, urge you to let them be. They are distinctive old timers with a job to
