**The Galway Public Library will host a special forum on human trafficking on May 21 at 7:00.** The event is open to the public and will be held at the Galway Central High School library, Route 147. Forum participants include Debbie Fowler, author of *Fragrance in the Desert*; Andy Gilpin, Associate Executive Director of CAPTAIN Youth & Family Services; and Sergeant Daniel P. Morley, Saratoga County Sheriff's Office.

Debbie Fowler encountered human trafficking during her husband's two-year assignment in Kuwait and wrote the book "to bring awareness to others that human trafficking is indeed on our doorsteps and in need of action." Proceeds from sales of her book are donated to organizations fighting human trafficking, such as Shared Hope International and Maiti Nepal.

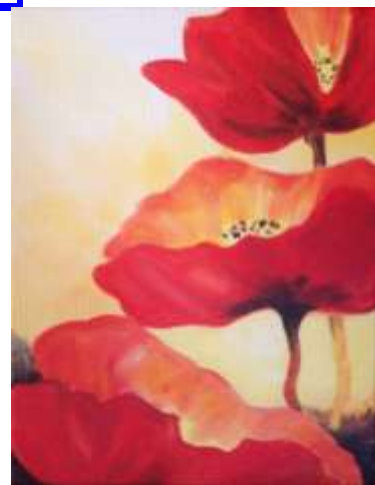
