The May meeting of the Galway Town Board was packed with residents and business owners airing complaints about "harassment" by Village Police in issuing an excessive number of traffic related tickets. Cock 'n Bull owner Rick Sleeper and Galway Market's Kevin Lovelass were among those who cited the negative effects of the overly vigilant police presence, causing people to bypass the Village and their businesses because of it. In just a 20 day period, it was noted, there were 220 tickets issued in one square mile of Galway. Supv. Paul Lent stated that the single largest complaint he has received since taking office has been with the Village Police Department. He also noted that all tickets issued for the Village have an adverse effect on the town, as the town receives no portion of the fine money, but incurs the expense of court time.

These complaints followed a presentation by two Village police officers who came to make the case that, for the safety of residents, police coverage should expand to the entire town, which is now served by State Police. Supv. Lent countered that he had researched the matter and found that Galway has one of the lowest crime rates in the county and that the need for added police presence did not appear to be justified. In other business, the Town received a complaint regarding the failure of the Town Board to take action on the Real Property Tax Reduction for Persons with Disabilities. Supv. Lent responded that it is too late to act on the item for this fiscal year but he would review it for the next budget cycle. He noted that nine other towns in the county offer this exemption benefit and it looks to have a very minimal impact of the budget.
