As you are probably aware, in June 2017, funding to build a new library building was approved by the voters of the Galway Central School District. Since then the Board of Trustees has been meeting with Butler Rowland Mays Architects to finalize construction documents for the project. The project went out to bid in early April, and bids were awarded in May. We are very excited about the prospect of a new facility to continue to serve the needs of the community.

Work is scheduled to begin in early June, with the official Groundbreaking Ceremony on Saturday, June 30 at 1 PM. Everyone is invited to celebrate this new addition to our community! Children are invited to bring toy shovels.

Construction is projected to be completed by June of 2019.

To the Galway Community, a Huge Thank You!

With the generous support of community members, the library opened in July of 1998. Although the library was established by referendum of the taxpayers of the Town of Galway in November 1997, no public funds were available until January of 1999. The community worked together to open the library. The Odd Fellows provided their building rent free; the Lions Club provided start-up funds; people donated books, a telephone, a copy machine; the Galway Preservation Society loaned a computer; and Union College donated discarded library shelving. Volunteers, 125 in number, stepped forward to operate the library for more than a year. Community residents contributed \$28,000 to the Founding Membership Drive to ensure the library's success.

In the intervening years, the community has helped the library to grow to the point where the library has outgrown the building on North Street. Last June, taxpayers in the Galway Central School District supported a referendum providing \$1,150,000 in public funding for the construction of a new library. Since then, the library's grants and fund development committees have been working to secure much of the remainder of funds needed to construct a new building on East Street.

Major donors to date include the Dockstader Charitable Trust, \$925,000; Stewart's Shops/the Dake Family, \$100,000; the GE Foundation, \$37,323 in matching funds; The Friends of the Library, \$15,300; the William Gundry Broughton Charitable Foundation, \$15,000; Ballston Spa National Bank, \$10,000; First Presbyterian Church of West Galway, \$5,000 and the JM McDonald Foundation, \$5,000. Additional funding includes a New York State Construction Aid grant of \$140,106, bullet aid through the offices of Assemblywoman Mary Beth Walsh, \$13,000 and Senator James Tedisco, \$4,000, and contributions by the members of the Boards of the Galway Public Library and Friends of the Library, \$47,680. Additionally, individuals have contributed \$65,000 to the new building fund. Thank you all!

There's still time and a need for everyone to have a part in the new building project. Funds are still needed to complete the acquisition of furnishings and shelving, AV equipment and landscaping. A capital fund brochure was mailed to school district residents a few weeks ago. We ask you to consider a contribution to the New Building Fund, a lasting gift to the Galway community.

As the library marks its 20th anniversary this July, we thank you for the generous contributions of volunteer time and money through the years. With your help the library was established. With your help, the new library building will be completed by next summer.

Libraries Rock!



This year's theme for the Summer Reading Program is "Libraries Rock!," and will emphasize geology, archaeology, and rock 'n' roll. The program encourages reading and participation in fun events. Readers track their minutes reading and the programs they attend to earn raffle tickets for prizes. Summer Reading will run from June 25 through August 23, and registration begins June 18. Our Summer Reading activities include starting a rock collection, making our own archaeological digs, making rock candy and "geodes," baking cookies (metamorphic and sedimentary), creating a PVC pipe "singing tree," and vegetable instruments. There will be presentations by Brookside Museum, the Tang Museum, Wilton Wildlife Preserve, and the Wildlife Institute of Eastern NY. On our last day, we will have a Salsa Awards Party with music to dance to and salsa made from our garden vegetables.

Our regular youth programs will also continue throughout the summer, including Pokémon Club, Lego Club, Tinker Thursday, Artful Monday, Crafternoon, Garden Club, Marvelous Machines, Weather Around Us, Story Time, and Makerspace. This summer, in cooperation with CAPTAIN Youth Services, we will be offering free lunch on Mondays, Thursdays, and Fridays at 1:00 beginning Monday, July 9 and ending Friday, August 24. Any child is eligible to receive a free lunch. Our youth programs are on Mondays and Thursdays, so a child can come for lunch and stay for the scheduled activities. It will be an exciting time for all.

Library Budget & Trustee Election Vote — Tuesday, June 12 from 1 PM to 8 PM at the Galway Public Library, 5264 Sacandaga Rd.

A public information meeting on the budget will be held at the library on Tuesday, June 5, at 7 PM.

Annual Budget: The public will be voting on a proposition to collect \$164,100 in school district property taxes for Fiscal Year 2018-19 to operate the Galway Public Library.

Trustee: There is 1 vacancy on the Board for a five-year term of office that will begin on July 1, 2018 and end on June 30, 2023. The seat will be vacated by Judith Knowlton, who was elected on June 14, 2016, to the seat vacated by Neil Goes on April 7, 2016, whose term of office began on July 1, 2013, and whose term will end June 30, 2018. Judith Knowlton is not running for re-election.

Any Galway School District resident who is a registered voter is eligible to vote.

The Friends of the Galway **Public Library** is a volunteer group which provides support for **OUR** library. Our board is made of community residents and our responsibility is to organize fundraising events to support library programs which are not funded by the library budget.
