

# \* Summer Reading Program\* Fantasy



## **Description:**

Clothespin and Popsicle-Stick Furniture

#### **Materials:**

- Popsicle sticks (about 22 for each chair, 21 for table)
- Clothespins (at least 14 for the pictured chair)
- Glue
- Tape
- Paint or stain, if desired
- Pruning shears or heavy-duty scissors

## Note/Tip:

• Remove the springs from the clothespins

- The shears or scissors will cut the popsicle sticks to length, if needed
- Use tape to hold the pieces together while the glue dries

#### **Instructions:**

- Once you have removed the springs from the clothespins, try laying them out in different ways to see what shapes they will make
- Glue up one section of the pictured chair at a time. Start with the legs, then the back, which is attached to the back legs
- Second, glue the skirting around the legs and under the seat
- Add the arms
- Finish with the seat you can use as many pieces as you like to cover the seat
- For the popsicle stick furniture, lay out the tabletop upside down and glue 2 strips across to hold the top pieces together
  - A square table top is easier to do than a circle
- The table in the picture has a specially-cut pedestal
- You can make legs like the one on your clothespin chair or invent your own pedestal or legs
- The round back on the chairs is difficult to cut with clippers or scissors, so make up your own design

## **Observations/Results:**

- Can you make up your own designs? Try a couch, a bed, or a picnic table
- How do you reinforce your furniture so it is stable

## **Additional Ideas:**

Find a space in your yard (where your parents will let you) and set up a little sitting area for a fairy garden (or an elf or wizard garden)
