

* Kandinsky Circle Ornament * Family Activity - Arts



Description:

The circle as a basic shape has always enchanted the human mind. Many mathematicians and philosophers consider it the most perfect of all geometric shapes. For artists the mysterious circle is something of wonder and beauty. Circles can appear in art either as circle shapes or as things stellar orbs, wheels, sundials, clocks, circular paths etc.

Wassily Kandinsky, is a famous artist, who is known for the use of circles in his work. He believed the circle had symbolic significance relating to the mysteries of the cosmos, and he used it as an abstract form.

Materials:

- Circles printable
- Scissors
- Markers
- Paper
- Cardboard
- Glue stick
- String
- Tape

Instructions:

- Pick up a packet at the library for this activity which includes the Circle templates.
- Cut out the circles and trace them onto colored construction paper, card stock, or poster board.



• Arrange the circles to form a Kandinsky inspired print and glue them in place!



• Tape a string to the back to hang your Christmas ornaments.



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
