Memory Project Programs (& Info for when patrons ask about the display/programs)

Working in partnership with The Memory Project Productions, Inc., the Southern Adirondack Library System (SALS), and Assemblywoman Carrie Woerner, the Galway Public Library, 2112 East Street, Galway, will host "Messages From Survivors: One Family's Holocaust Legacy," a powerful new traveling exhibit about the Holocaust, survival, resiliency, and the importance of family and remembering during the month of May. An opening reception will be held on Saturday, May 4 from 11-2, which will include a presentation of "Dance: A Morale Booster." The Library will also host related programs, activities, and displays during the month designed educate and to spark conversation about the time period.

The exhibit is not just about the Holocaust, but also about the importance of families and sharing family stories, remembering your family's past through the generations.

Programs & activities planned to compliment and expand on this powerful exhibit about the Holocaust, survival, and resiliency:

- Monday, April 22 from 7-8:30 PM In preparation for this exhibit, and to spark conversations about the time period, When Readers Meet will be reading and discussing The Dressmakers of Auschwitz by Lucy Adlington.
- Saturday, May 4 from 10-11 AM Family Stories: Preserving History Workshop for all ages (under 8 with an adult). Pick up interview worksheets at the library in advance of the program and use them to gather information and pictures about members of your family. Bring your collected information to the workshop and we will help you create a scrapbook with poetry, pictures, drawings, and/or stories to help you preserve and remember your family history and special loved ones.
- Saturday, May 4 from 11-2 Opening Reception for Messages From Survivors: One Family's Holocaust Legacy. In conjunction, at 12 PM, there will be a presentation by Jake Goldsmith about European folk dance and how the war impacted cultural traditions called "Dance: A Morale Booster." This portion of the program will include a video of European folk dancing and a few lessons on how to do some of these traditional dances. There will be light traditional Jewish foods & refreshments and a coordinated online display of some of the architecture, art and dance that was lost when the Nazis invaded Eastern Europe.
- The Young Professionals Book Discussion group for ages 16-35 will be reading Code Name Sapphire by Pam Jenoff and discussing what they read and learned on Wednesday, May 8 at 7 PM.

 On Thursday, May 16th at 6 PM, local citizen, Geza Ginzery, will give a special talk and answer questions about some of his and his family's experiences in Hungary prior, during and after World War II. "The Two-Fold Invasion: Never to Be the Same". Come hear his amazing stories.

- In support of the Memory Project exhibit, the Galway Public Library Photography Club was asked to provide photos for a complimentary display at the library during the month of May. The guidelines were to take black-and-white and monochrome photographs, with no restriction on subject, but with images in which the main subject or points of interest were well-lit with black or deep shadows in the background, a form of chiaroscuro. The pictures would ideally evoke emotions whether positive or negative. They will talk about their photos during their May meeting on the 29th.
- There will be a book display during the whole month of books on the Holocaust, Eastern Europe, WW II, family, & memories.
- There will also be a timeline of the events leading up to and during WWII as well as a
 display of the major battles hanging in the library. A scavenger hunt will be available
 surrounding these topics to help kids learn more about this time period.
- The Galway Central School District will also be hosting a display of the exhibit panels in the high school library to raise awareness of history with the students.
- There will be a table set up in the library the whole month of May for patrons to write and decorate "kindness quotes." The intention is for the maker to share their quote with someone else as an act of kindness.
