- All registered voters in the Galway Central School District may vote in the Library's annual budget and trustee election.
- The public will vote on a proposition to collect \$253,850 in property taxes to operate the library for the 2025-2026 fiscal year.
- A budget information meeting will be held at the library on Wednesday, June 4th at 6:30 PM.
- There will be two five-year positions to fill on the Board of Trustees. The seats are being vacated by Jim Hodsoll and Sue Wemple, and neither is seeking reelection.
- Absentee ballot applications are available at the library.




